BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

The Western Pacific Railroad Company is authorized to con-
struct a spur track at grade across Madison Street on the south side of
Third Street in the City of Oakland, County of Alameda, as described in
the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. 4-701.

Applicant shall bear the entire construction and maintenance
expense. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of
G.O. No. 72, without superelevation, and of a width to conform to the
portion of the street now graded with tops of rails flush with roadway
and with grades of approach not exceeding two per cent. Protection
shall be by existing Standard No. 1 crossing signs (G.O. No. 75-B).

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order
applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authoriza-
tion shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be
extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization
may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety
so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
