ORDER

The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company, a corporation, is authorized to construct two spur tracks at grade across streets and an alley in the City of Stockton, County of San Joaquin, at the locations described in the application, and shown on Division Engineer's Drawing No. V-16-167 attached to the application, to be identified as follows:

East Hazelton Avenue) and) B Street) between E. Hazelton Ave.) and E. Scotts Ave.)	61-2.10-C	Existing No. 2 crossing sign. 1 Standard No. 1 crossing sign.
Alley between) E. Hazelton Ave.) and E. Scotts Ave.)	61-2.13-C	1 Std. No. 1 crossing sign.
East Scotts Avenue	61-2.16-C	1 Std. No. 1 crossing sign.

Applicant shall bear the entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without superelevation and with a width of not less than twenty-four (24) feet, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding two per cent.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time

be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. . Authoriza-
tion may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or
safety so require.

This order shall be effective immediately..
