OPINION AND ORDER

By the above entitled supplemental application Pacific Greyhound Lines reducets an order of this Commission authorizing resumption of passenger stage service between Corcoran and Tulare and intermediate points via Waukena.

Suspension of the service in question was authorized by Decision No. 36241, in Application No. 25505, dated March 16, 1943, "... until 180 days after the termination of the present war shall have been officially proclaimed, or until such earlier time as the Commission by further order may designate." The reason for the temporary discontinuance was to permit maximum utilization of Pacific Greyhound: Lines," equipment in compliance with general orders of the Office of Defense Transportation.

Applicant alleges the conditions relied upon for granting suspension no longer exist now that the war is terminated. Pecific Greyhound Lines desires to resume its former service to the points involved.

It does not appear that this is a matter requiring public hearing. The authority sought will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,





IT IS ORDERED:

- (1) That Pacific Greyhound Lines is authorized to resume its passenger stage service between Corcoran and Tularc and intermediate points via Waukena originally granted by Decision No. 29384, in Application No. 20761, dated December 26, 1936.
- (2) That before Pacific Greyhound Lines resumes said service pursuant to this certificate, it shall comply with the provisions of General Order No. 79 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A by filing, in triplicate, and concurrently making effective appropriate tariffs and time tables within 30 days from the effective date hereof and on not less than 1 day's notice to the Commission and the public.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
