

Decision No. 38751

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

ORIGINAL

In the Matter of the Application of Oscar H. Ivey and Winifred B. Ivey, operating a telephone exchange at Mariposa under the name and title of MARIPOSA TELEPHONE EXCHANGE, for an order authorizing applicants to apply a rate of five cents (5¢) for local calls from a public pay station.

O R D E R

Applicants request authority to charge five cents for each local telephone message from local pay stations within the territory of the Mariposa Telephone Exchange, Mariposa County. No charge is now made for local calls placed from the two public pay stations served by applicants, who intend to provide additional public pay stations. Appropriate notification was given the Office of Price Administration.

Finding that a public hearing is unnecessary, that the application should be granted, and that the establishment of this rate is reasonable and justified,

IT IS ORDERED that applicants hereby are authorized to charge and collect five cents for each local exchange message from local pay stations within the territory of the Mariposa Telephone Exchange on and after April 15, 1946.

Necessary tariff filings, in accordance with General Order No. 96, shall be made on or before April 10, 1946.

This order shall become effective immediately.
