O P I N I O N

In this application, Henry D. Little is applying for a license to engage in the business of a motor carrier transportation agent, as defined in the Motor Carrier Transportation Agent Act (Ch. 390, Stats. 1933, as amended). A hearing was held at Los Angeles before Examiner Cannon on April 18, 1946, at which applicant testified in his own behalf. The record shows that applicant was arrested in Oklahoma and found guilty of a violation of the Internal Revenue Laws relating to liquor on August 7, 1934. On January 31, 1935, he pleaded guilty and on three counts of the indictment was sentenced to 6 months and fined \$1,100. He was granted a stay of commitment to June 1, 1935, and on that date was placed on probation for 18 months. However, on November 2, 1935, probation was revoked and defendant was required to serve the sentence. There is also a report from United States Army records that Little operated a travel service at Huntington Park, California, from November 1944, to January 1946, and that he refused to give a receipt for money received from a prospective passenger.

The record also shows that Little had placed a passenger aboard a car which purported to have as its destination a point in Nebraska, when as a matter of fact it went only as far as Oklahoma City. The passenger was unable to get any refund either from the driver of the car or the Little Travel Service.

Upon due consideration of the facts of record the Commission is of the opinion that the applicant should not be granted a license.

O R D E R

A public hearing having been had in the above entitled proceeding, evidence having been received, the matter having been submitted, and the Commission now being fully advised in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED that the application of Henry D. Little for a license to operate as a motor carrier transportation agent at 2569 Randolph, Huntington Park, California; be and the same is hereby denied.
