O P I N I O N

Applicant is applying for a license as a motor carrier transportation agent as defined in the Motor Carrier Transportation Agent Act (Ch. 390, Stats. 1933, as amended). Public hearing was held by Examiner Gannon at Los Angeles on April 18, 1946.

The records of the Los Angeles Police Department show that Canada was arrested nine times during the years 1930 to 1939 on various charges of a serious nature. The applicant stated that he was convicted only on a traffic violation charge. His application states that he had never been known by any other name except the one under which he seeks to be licensed. On cross examination, however, he testified that he had also been known as Roy Miller.

In our opinion the applicant should not be granted a license as a motor carrier transportation agent, and that will be the order.

ORDER

A public hearing having been had in the above entitled proceeding, evidence having been received, the matter having been submitted, and the Commission now being fully advised in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED that the application of Leroy Canada for a license to operate as a motor carrier transportation agent at 111727 Holmes Avenue, Los Angeles, California, be, and the same is hereby denied.
