ORDER OF REVOCATION

By Decision No. 37204, dated July 18, 1944, the Commission issued a certificate to Railway Express Agency, Incorporated, authorizing it to conduct a highway common carrier service between Los Angeles and Burbank, on the one hand, and various other points in Southern California, on the other hand.

By supplemental application the Commission is requested to authorize discontinuance of the above described service, and to revoke the operative right granted by said Decision No. 37204. As justification therefor, the application states:

That the operation was established and conducted primarily for the handling of a large volume of traffic vital to the war emergency, the need for which no longer exists; that the small amount of traffic remaining can, in the future, be transported adequately on the passenger trains of the Pacific Electric Railway Company, with whom applicant contracts for the handling of express matter in its custody.

After full consideration it appears that applicant's request is justified and the application will be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED as follows:

(1) That Railway Express Agency, Incorporated, is hereby authorized to discontinue and abandon operations as a highway common carrier between the points authorized by Decision No. 37204.

(2) That the certificate authorizing such operations granted by Decision No. 37204, dated July 18, 1944, is hereby revoked and annulled effective concurrently with the cancellation of tariffs as provided for in paragraph (3) of this order, but such revocation and annulment shall become effective not later than 35 days after the effective date hereof.

(3) That applicant shall file supplements to its effective tariffs and time tables, in triplicate, within 30 days from the effective date hereof, and on not less than 1 day's notice to the Commission and the public, showing the discontinuance of service as herein authorized.

The effective date of this order shall be 20 days from the date hereof.
