San Diego and Arizona Eastern Railway Company is authorized | to construct an industrial spur track along and across "L" Street and across Ninth Avenue in San Diego, San Diego County, at the locations described in the application, to be identified as follows:

Crossing of "L" Street as Crossing No. 36-1.23-C, and Crossing of Ninth Avenue as a portion of Crossing No. 36-1.2-C.

Applicant shall bear the entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding two per cent.

San Diego Ges and Electric Company has executed a written agreement to remove the two power poles from the south side of "L" Street, between Eighth Avenue and Ninth Avenue, therefore exemption is granted from the provisions of Section 2 (c) of General Order No. 26-C, so as to permit the construction of the track at a distance of 8.5 feet from the property line, instead of 10 feet, as prescribed therein.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time
