## OPINION

Peter J. van Loben Sels, doing business as El Monte Transit Lines, seeks authority to establish service as a common carrier for the transportation of persons in El Monte and vicinity.

Public hearing in this proceeding was held before Examiner Chiesa at El Monte on May 2, 1946. Evidence having been adduced, the matter was submitted for decision.

Applicant proposes to inaugurate service along a route, operating two lines, which would serve the business district of

El Monte and "Five Points" and a residential area generally north of the city. Each line will cover a round-trip distance of approximately eight miles.

It is proposed to charge a one-way fare of 10 cents. No round-trip or commutation tickets will be offered. Schedules will be operated half-hourly from 6:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and from 5:00 p.m. to 7:10 p.m., and hourly from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Service after 7:10 p.m. is not contemplated but will be established if a need for later schedules develops.

Motor bus equipment proposed to be used in the operation of the service consists of two new 27-passenger Ford Transit coaches and one additional used bus to be maintained for standby operations. Applicant testified that he can get delivery on the new equipment within 30 to 60 days.

Applicant has not heretofore operated a passenger stage service but has had considerable transportation experience while sorving in the armed forces. The evidence also shows that applicant is financially responsible.

Estimated gross income is approximately \$70 per day (700 passengers) or \$1,820 per month on the basis of 26 operating days. "Out-of-pecket" operating costs are estimated to be approximately \$1,277 monthly.

Numerous witnesses, businessmen, residents, and representatives of civic, fraternal, and social organizations testified in support of the application. The evidence shows that in excess of 20,000 persons reside in the area proposed to be served and within reasonable walking distance (1/4 mile) of the proposed

lines. There are approximately 4,074 homes in the area and in addition to the principal business section of El Monto, a business district at the intersection of Garvey Avenue and Valley Boulevard, known as "Five Points", will also become accessible to the residents of the community.

No other carrier serves this community locally except one which operates along Valloy Boulevard. This carrier does not oppose the granting of the application.

The application is supported by the City of El Monte.

Having considered the application and the evidence of record in this preceeding, we are of the opinion and find that public convenience and necessity require the establishment of the proposed service, and, therefore, the application will be granted.

Peter J. van Loben Sels is hereby placed upon notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate-fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, they extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be changed or destroyed at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited to the number of rights which may be given.

Beginning at the intersection of Valley
Boulevard and Columbia Street, thence along
Columbia Street, Heyt Avenue, Valley Boulevard,
Tyler Avenue, Freer Street, El Monte Avenue,
Lower Azusa Road, Peck Road, Stewart Street,
Ramona Boulevard (San Bernardine Road), Valley
Boulevard, Mountain View Road, Lansdale Street,
Cogswell Road, The Wyo Drive, La Madera Avenue,
Rio Hende Parkway, Peck Road to its intersection
with Lower Azusa Road. Also, along Valley.
Boulevard between Tyler Avenue and Ramona Boulevard.

Applicant is authorized to turn his motor vehicles at termini and intermediate points, in either direction, at intersections of streets or by operating around a block contiguous to such intersection, or in accordance with local traffic rules.
