ORDER OF REVOCATION

Decision No. 37052, dated May 12, 1944, as amended by Decision No. 37097, dated May 31, 1944, in the above entitled matter, granted a certificate to Edward C. McKinstry, authorizing passenger stage service between Santa Ana and Orange on the one hand, and the Douglas Aircraft Plant, North Long Beach, near Lakewood Village, on the other hand.

On May 13, 1946, the Commission received a letter from E. C. McKinstry reading as follows:

"This is to notify you that I ceased operations on May 6, 1946, between Santa Ana and Douglas Aircraft Corporation, Long Beach, California.

"Consequently you may cancel my franchise, etc."

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity above referred to is hereby revoked and annulled and all effective tariffs and time tables on file with the Commission in the name of E. C. McKinstry are hereby cancelled.
