SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Southern Pacific Company and Pacific Motor Trucking Company are common carriers serving Palo Alto. By petition, filed May 22, 1946, they seek authority to enlarge their pickup and delivery zones at that point and to extend their present rates to the additional territory.

The area involved is within three miles of the corporate limits of Palo Alto. The verified petition alleges that this contiguous area is actually a part of the community; that certain industries located in the proposed territory have requested pickup and delivery service; that petitioners desire to provide the same service and to charge the same rates as those now applicable within their existing zones; and that there are no industries or persons similarly situated which are not now receiving comparable service under the Palo Alto rates. . . Competing carriers have been notified of the filing of the petition and have offered no objection to its being granted, .

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the petition should be granted. .

Therefore, good cause appearing, .

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the aforesaid petition be and it is hereby granted; that petitioners be and they are hereby authorized to establish, for the transportation involved, rates less than the minimum rates prescribed by Decision No. 31606, as amended, in this proceeding, but not less than those prescribed for like transportation from and to Palo Alto; and that tariffs filed pursuant to this order may be made effective on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

The authority herein granted shall be void unless exercised within ninety (90) days of the effective date hereof.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
