INTERIM OPINION

By Decision No. 38153, dated Jugust 14, 1945, the Commission granted a certificate to Joe West authorizing highway common carrier operations between Los Angeles, Zone 1, on the one hand, and Needles and points intermediate to Needles and Daggett and the military installation at Freda, on the other hand. Such certificate bore an expiration date of March 1, 1946, which was extended to July 1, 1946, by Decision No. 38747, dated March 5, 1946.

On May 25, 1946, applicant West filed a second supplemental application requesting the Commission to make permanent the certificate above referred to. Pending a determination thereon, the Commission is requested to extend again the authority granted by said Decision No. 38153, for a reasonable period beyond July 1, 1946.

The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway Company and Railway Express Agency, Inc., which provide common carrier scrvices between points involved, have informed the Commission that they waive objection to a temporary extension for such authority.

After full consideration we believe that applicant's reducst is reasonable and should be granted for an additional temporary period to expire October 31, 1946.

INTERIM ORDER

An application therefor having been filed and it being hereby found that public convenience and necessity so require,

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate heretofore granted to Joe West by Decision No. 38153 shall expire October 31, 1946, unless extended by further order of the Commission.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant shall comply with the provisions of General Order No. 80 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A by filing, in triplicate and concurrently making effective tariffs, or supplements thereto, and time tables satisfactory to the Commission within 60 days from the effective date hereof and on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and the public reflecting the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
