SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By prior orders in this proceeding, applicant has been authorized to transport iron and steel articles for Columbia Steel Company from Torrance to points within a 20-mile radius at rates less than the prescribed minimum rates. The authority expires July 12, 1946. An extension for a one-year period is now sought.

The verified application shows that the transportation involved is performed under unusually favorable conditions; that, during the last two years, greater efficiency has been attained in conducting the operations; and that in the aggregate the revenue derived from the authorized rates equals or exceeds that which would accrue under the prescribed minimum rates and will continue to provide a reasonable profit.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the proposed extention should be authorized.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of Decision No. 34400, as amended, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby

extended to July 12; 1947; unless sooner changed or further extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective July 12; 1946.
