OPINION.

Joseph B. Spence, the applicant, holds a certificate from the Commission authorizing the transportation of passengers (1) and baggage between Nevada City and Grass Valley.

In the application before us he requests authority to enlarge such operation by extending the service to what is known as Alta Hill District and Oaks Subdivision, both outside the city limits of Grass Valley, and south to the city limits on South Auburn Street.

The reason impelling the filing of the application is the alleged need for additional service due to the growth of the communities lying outside the city limits. The application states that the population within one mile outside the city limits has increased to 5,000 persons, and within the city limits to 7,000 persons, with present transportation service limited to that furnished by applicant's bus line. The proposed one-way fare is 10 cents for adults and 5 cents for children to Oaks Subdivision and Alta Hill District and 5 cents within the city limits. Upon initiation, the proposed service will be operated from 8:30 a.m. to 11 p.m. with one bus of 25 passenger seating capacity.

The only public carrier operating in this area is Kent E. Walker, doing business as Nevada County Bus Line. Applicant's proposed service would operate only over that portion of Walker's Marysville-Grass Valley Highway route (Tahoe-Ukiah Highway No. 20) between the Grass Valley City limits and the junction of this highway with a county road known as Dead Man Flat Road. Walker has filed with the Commission a letter stating that he has no objection to the granting of the Spence application.

It appears that the proposed extension is in the public interest and the application will therefore be granted. A public hearing does not appear necessary.

ORDER

Application having been made in the above entitled proceeding, and the Commission being duly advised,

IT IS ORDERED:

- (1) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Joseph B. Spence, an individual, authorizing the establishment and operation of service as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 2; of the Public Utilities Act, for the transportation of passengers and shipments of express weighing not to exceed 100 pounds, on passenger carrying vehicles only, over the routes hereinafter described in the City of Grass Valley and between points on these routes and Alta Hill District and Oaks Subdivision, as more particularly described in service regulation (c) of this order, as an extension and enlargement of applicant's present operative rights.
 - (2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate

proceeding to Colfax Avenue. Turn left on Colfax Avenue, proceeding to Ophir Street, thence right on Ophir Street, proceeding to Race Street, thence right on Race Street, proceeding to South Auburn Street, thence left at South Auburn Street, proceeding to city limits. Beturn on South Auburn Street to Main Street, turning left on West Main Street, thence proceed to starting point at West Main and Church Streets.

Operate in reverse movement on first route outside the city and alternating trips between Oaks Subdivision and Alta Hill District:

The effective date of this order shall be 20 days from the date hereof.
