BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of ASEURY RAPID TRANSIT SYSTEM, a corporation, for authority to suspend for the duration of the present war emergency the operation of its presently authorized service for the transportation of passengers, baggage, express, and freight between Los Angeles and Pasadena, on the one hand, and Mount Wilson on the other hand.

## OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 36256 authorized Asbury Rapid Transit System, a corporation, to suspend, until further order of the Commission, the operation of its service as a passenger stage corporation and a highway common carrier between Los Angeles and Pasadena, on the one hand, and Mount Wilson on the other hand, over its Los Angeles-Pasadena-Mount Wilson Division. Such suspension was in consonance with orders of the Office of Defense Transportation, which prohibited this type of service. By the instant application, applicant alleges that the conditions prevalent at the time the suspension order was issued no longer exist, and that considerable activity is now taking place on Mount Wilson in connection with the establishment and construction of several television stations. The Observatory and the Mount Wilson Hotel have been reopened to the public, and there appears to be justification for re-establishment of the Service.

Therefore, and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDIRED that the suspension authorized by Decision No. 36256 shall terminate as of August 15, 1946, and Asbury Rapid Transit System is hereby authorized to re-establish its suspended service on, or immediately thereafter, and file appropriate tariffs

and time tables within thirty days from the effective date hercof, and on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and the public. The effective date of this order shall be the date hercof.
