O R D E R

The Department of Public Works of the State of California is authorized to construct a crossing of State Highway Route 17 at separated grades under the eastward main line track of Southern Pacific Company near Auburn, Placer County, at the location as shown by map (Exhibit A) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. AI-126.3-B. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Company shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.

Applicant is further authorized to construct a temporary crossing at grade of a detour road with track of Southern Pacific Company. Said grade crossing shall be protected by two Standard No. 3 Wigwags. Upon completion of the construction of Crossing No. AI-126.3-B said grade crossing as well as the existing crossing No. AI-126.2-B shall be abandoned and removed.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within two years, unless time be extended, or if conditions are not complied with. This

order shall be effective immediately.
