SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

In Decision 33167, dated June 4th, 1940, in the above-entitled application the Commission authorized Southern Pacific Company to abandon its agency station at Ceres, Stanislaus County, and among the conditions under which such authority was granted the decision required that the Company make accessible to the public the railroad telephone located at said station. Applicant now states that persons desiring to communicate with the company agency at Modesto use the regular commercial telephone service and do not avail themselves of the use of the railroad telephone. Therefore Applicant has requested by supplemental application a modification of said Decision 33167.

Good Cause Appearing, IT IS ORDERED that Condition 2 of the Commission's Decision No. 33167 in this application is modified to read as follows:

"(2) Southern Pacific Company shall store less-carload freight shipments under lock and key in company's warehouse. The key to the warehouse shall be obtainable from a custodian located at or near said station and notice advising shippers where the key may be secured shall be maintained at the warehouse."

In all other respects said Decision No. 33167 is in full force and effect.
