## SIXTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 35133 of March 17, 1942, as amended, in this proceeding, authorized applicant to suspend public utility warehouse operations at Los Angeles Harbor until October 1, 1946. The property involved in these operations was acquired April 4, 1942 by the United States Government through condemnation proceedings. It was returned to applicant on June 30, 1946. Authority is now sought to continue the suspension of operations until January 1, 1947.

The verified supplemental application shows that a final settlement between applicant and the Government providing for restoration of the premises and equipment is still pending; that following settlement with the Government, thirty to sixty days will be required to prepare the property for utility operations; and that other public utility warehouse facilities will be adequate in the interim.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the proposed extension of authority is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Western Compress Company, a corporation, be and it is hereby authorized to suspend public utility operations at Los Angeles Harbor until January 1, 1947; and that said Western Compress Company shall forthwith amend its tariff on file with the Commission to show that operations have been further suspended as authorized herein.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
