SECOND INTERIM OPINION

By Decision No. 38153, dated August 14, 1945, the Commission granted a certificate to Joe West authorizing highway common carrier operations between Los Angeles, Zone 1, on the one hand, and Needles and points intermediate to Needles and Daggett and other points, on the other hand. Such certificate bore an expiration date of March 1, 1946, but has been extended by subsequent decisions the last being Decision No. 39097, dated June 18, 1946, which fixed the expiration date as of October 31, 1946.

Applicant West now has on file a supplemental application requesting the Commission to make the above referred to certificate permanent. Pending a determination thereon, the Commission is requested to extend the authority granted by Decision No. 38153 for a reasonable period beyond October 31, 1946.

The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway Company and Railway Express Agency, Incorporated, which provide common carrier services between points involved, have informed the Commission that they waive objection to a temporary extension of such authority.

After full consideration, we believe that applicant's request is reasonable and should be granted for an additional temporary period to expire February 28, 1947.

SECOND INTERIM ORDER

An application therefor having been filed and it being hereby found that public convenience and necessity so require,

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate heretofore granted to Joe West by Decision No. 38153, shall expire February 28, 1947, unless extended by further order of the Commission.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant shall comply with the provisions of General Order No. 80 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A by filing, in triplicate and concurrently making effective tariffs, and time tables, or supplements thereto, satisfactory to the Commission within 60 days from the effective date hereof and on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and the public reflecting the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
