

Decision No. 39672

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of the COUNTY OF MONTEREY by the Board of Supervisors of said County of Monterey for the authorization to construct a crossing at grade of Sanborn Road and the tracks of the Southern Pacific Railroad, at E. S. 1955 + 69.83 near Spreckels Junction, and approximately two (2) miles south of Salinas Depot, in the County of Monterey, State of California.

O R D E R

The County of Monterey is authorized to construct Sanborn Road, temporarily at grade across the main line tracks of Southern Pacific Company near Spreckels Junction in that County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. E120.2. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 40 feet and grades of approach not greater than one per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard automatic crossing signals. (G. O. 75-B.)

Upon completion, the private crossing about 1,500 feet northerly shall be abandoned and closed. The crossing herein authorized may be maintained for a period of two years from the date of this order, unless time be extended. Upon expiration of said two year period or upon completion of the grade separation of Sanborn Road heretofore authorized in Decision No. 39395, Application No. 27726, the crossing herein authorized shall be removed at the expense of the applicant.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be

extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
