## <u>0 R D E R</u>

Southern Pacific Company has made application for an order authorizing the closing of a publicly used road crossing with its tracks in Arbuckle, Colusa County, the crossing being under county jurisdiction and being identified in the Commission's records as Crossing No. AE-II3.5.

The application recites that applicant conducts high speed and frequent rail operations over this line, that visibility at the crossing is poor, and that present users of the crossing will not suffer inconvenience if it is abolished. The Board of Supervisors of Colusa County by resolution, dated November 19, 1946, has approved the closing of the crossing.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary, that it is in the public interest that the crossing be closed, and that an order authorizing such closing should be made, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is authorized and directed to abolish by physical closing the crossing of a publicly used road, identified as Crossing Nov AE-113.6, with its tracks in the Town of Arbuckle, Colusa County.

The entire cost of closing and abolishing said crossing shall be borne by Southern Pacific Company.

Within thirty days thereafter applicant shall report to the Commission in writing of the closing of said crossing. The effective date shall be twenty days from the date hereof.
