ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHT

It appearing that by Decision No. 33086 of May 6, 1940, in the above-numbered application, Guy S. Alexander, doing business as Beacon Transport Company, was granted a certificate to operate an automotive service for the transportation of passengers, baggage, and express, as a passenger stage corporation, and for the transportation of property as a highway common carrier between Laws, on the one hand, and South Lake, Lake Sabrina, and North Lake, on the other hand, and intermediate points, via Bishop, North Fork Junction, Parcher's Camp, and Camp Sabrina, subject to certain exceptions and limitations as more specifically detailed in said decision: It further appearing that no Annual Reports for the calendar years 1943 to 1945, inclusive, have been filed by said carrier and that it is delinquent in the filing of its Annual Report for 1946; It further appearing that no report of motor miles performed by said carrier has been rendered to date; it further appearing that said carrier has at no time made an application to this Commission for permission to suspend any operation herein and that no such permission has been granted; and it further appearing that investigations by the Commission's staff disclose that all service has been discontinued, and it being found that the entire operation and service of said carrier, as author-1zed by Decision No. 33086, of May 6, 1940, have been discontinued

without authority of the Commission, thereby resulting in abandon, ment of operation; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the above-mentioned operative right of Guy C. Alexander, doing business as Beacon Transport Company, to, from, or between the points and over the routes hereinbefore described, be and the same is hereby revoked and all effective tariffs and time tables on file are hereby cancelled and annulled.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the effective date of this order shall be the twentieth day after service thereof in the manner provided by law, unless said Guy C. Alexander, before such effective date, shall have filed with the Commission a written response to this order, denying the facts set forth herein and requesting public hearing thereon, in which event the effective date of this order will be stayed until hearing is had and further order issued.
