FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 39572 of October 29, 1946, in this proceeding, applicants were authorized to transport flour in truckload lots between points within the City of San Diego, and to perform certain accessorial services in connection with this transportation, at rates less than the established minimum rates. The authority is scheduled to expire October 29, 1947. Its indefinite extension is now sought.

The verified supplemental application alleges that no substantial changes have been experienced in the operations in question; that wages have increased recently but that these increases have been offset by the greater efficiency of applicants' experienced employees who have returned from military service; and that the authorized rates are still adequate.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that an extension is justified and should be granted. It will, however, be limited to a one-year period, subject to such earlier modification or further extension as may be warranted by future developments.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the

authority granted Floyd A. Greene and D. J. Glardon, copartners doing business as Arrow Transfer, by Decision No. 39572 of October 29, 1946, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby extended to October 29, 1948, unless sooner changed or further extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
