BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the matter of the application of Pacific Electric Railway Company, a corporation, and Los Angeles Transit Lines, a corporation, for an in lieu certificate for their jointly operated motor coach lines.

32nd Supplemental Application No. 18820

Extend route of Western Avenue Line.

ORIGINAL

O P I N I O N

Pacific Electric Railway Company and Los Angeles Transit Lines, in the name of Los Angeles Motor Coach Lines, operate a line along Western Avenue in the city of Los Angeles between Hollywood Boulevard and 104th Street under certificates of public convenience and necessity issued by the Commission in Decisions Nos. 26079 dated June 19, 1933, and 32522 dated October 31, 1939. By the 32nd Supplement to the above-numbered application, authority is sought to continue the line southerly along Western Avenue from 104th Street to 111th Street, a distance of approximately one-half mile. As justification for this request applicant states that residential development in the district proposed to be served by this extension has

~~undergone~~ an intense development and the proposed extension would provide direct public transportation to residents now without such service.

Fares in effect to 104th Street will be made applicable to the new terminus and present schedules will be extended from 104th Street to 111th Street. It appears that the request is in the public interest and should be granted. No hearing is required.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that the route description of applicants' Western Avenue Line contained in Decision No. 26079, and supplemented by Decision No. 32522, be amended to read:

Western Avenue Line. Commencing at the intersection of Western Avenue and Hollywood Boulevard, thence south along Western Avenue to 111th Street.

The authorization herein granted is subject to the following conditions:

1. Applicants shall file a written acceptance of the authority herein granted within a period of not to exceed thirty (30) days from the effective date hereof.
2. Applicants shall, within sixty (60) days from the effective date hereof and upon not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the public, establish service herein authorized and comply with the provisions of General Order No. 79 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A by filing in triplicate and concurrently making effective tariffs and time tables satisfactory to the Commission.

In all other respects Decision No. 26079, as subsequently amended, and Decision No. 32522 shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall be effective immediately.
