ORDER

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct a side track at grade across Cedar Street in the vicinity of 8th Street and across Cedar Street in the vicinity of 10th Street, and a spur track at grade in the vicinity of 9th Street, and to relocate a spur track across 8th Street at Cedar Street (Crossing No. A-5.44-C), all in the City of Oakland, County of Alameda. The crossing of Cedar Street at 8th Street shall be identified as No. A-5.48-C, that of Cedar Street near 10th Street as No. A-5.25-C and Cedar Street near 9th Street as No. A-5.41-C. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossings shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without superlevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the streets now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding two per cent. Protection shall be by Standard No. 1 crossing signs (G. O. No. 75-B).

Upon completion applicant shall remove the trackage indicated in yellow on the print accompanying the application.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with.

Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. This order shall be effective twenty days from the date hereof.
