O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct two additional side tracks at grade across Winton Avenue in Hayward, Alameda County, at the locations described in the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. D-20.6. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without super-elevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the avenue now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding two per cent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (G. O. No. 75-B). Pending installation of said signals applicant may operate over the crossings herein authorized provided all train movements are brought to a stop before passing over the crossing, and traffic on the highway is protected by flagman.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. This order shall be effective on the date hereof.
