O R D E R

The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company is authorized to construct one additional spur track at grade across a portion of Quint Street between Fairfax and Galvez Avenues, across portions of Galvez Avenue northwest of Quint Street and across Rankin Street in San Francisco, at the locations described in the application. The crossing with a portion of Quint Street shall be identified as a portion of Crossing No. 2SF-2.38-C. Galvez Avenue and Rankin Street are not open at the points of crossing and this order shall not be construed as authority for such opening. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said Crossing No. 2SF-2.38-C shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding two per cent. Protection shall be by existing Standard No. 1 crossing signs (G. O. No. 75-B).

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or

safety so require. This order shall be effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
