OPINION AND ORDER

I. A. Larrance is engaged in the warchouse business at Torrance, Los Angeles County. By this application he seeks authority to lease the building and to sell the warehouse equipment and other property used in the business to George M. Miller for a cash consideration of \$7,200.

The verified application shows that Miller is an experienced warchouseman. He proposes to establish storage and accessorial service rates and charges generally lower than Larrance's. No change in the service available to the public is contemplated.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that I. A. Larrance may, within sixty (60) days from the effective date hereof, lease the building and sell the other warehouse property involved in this proceeding to George M. Miller; and that prior to the effective date of said lease and sale I. A. Larrance shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, cancel his warehouse tariff, and that concurrently therewith and on like notice, George Miller shall establish the rates, rules and regulations set forth in

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Exhibit B of the application; that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
