## FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OFINION AND ORDER

Py Decision No. 40255, issued on May 6, 1947, the applicant herein was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the operation of a passenger and express service between Jackson and Bartons and between Jackson and Electra. Service in accordance with said certificate was commenced on June 7, 1947, pursuant to the filing of tariffs and time schedules. It is alleged in the instant application that demand for transportation to the various projects of the Pacific Gas and Electric Company, with the territory served by applicant, has been largely suspended for the winter season, and several of the private roads over which applicant is required to operate in serving said projects are not safe for operation during the winter months.

In view of these circumstances, applicant requests authority to operate an on-call service, in lieu of a scheduled service, on all of the operations covered by said certificate, said on-call service to be rendered only when not less than seven fares in one direction are  $\begin{pmatrix} 1 \end{pmatrix}$ offered to applicant.

It appears that the proposed modification of the service is

in the public interest and the application will be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that ordering paragraph I of said Decision No. 40255 be amended by adding thereto the following:

> "Provided that all of said service may be operated on an on-call basis beginning November 25, 1947, and ending June 1, 1948, said on-call service to be rendered only when not less than seven fares in one direction are offered to applicant, provided that less than seven persons may receive service by payment of the equivalent of seven one-way fares."

Applicant is authorized to file appropriate supplements to his tariff on not less than 5 days' notice to the Commission and the public, in consonance with the foregoing amendment.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in all other respects said Decision No. 40255 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
