SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

"Wholesale parcel city delivery" rates producing lower per-shipment charges than the general San Francisco drayage rates were cancelled, effective July 5, 1947, by Decision No. 40057 of March 17, 1947, in this proceeding. Temporary authority to continue to observe "parcel" rates has been granted certain carriers pending hearing and disposition of their petitions seeking permission to maintain such rates.¹

By petitions filed January 27 and 29, 1948, respectively, Don D'Onofrio, an individual doing business as Donofrio Drayage, and John R. Barr, an individual doing business as Neighborhood Delivery Service, request like authority. Temporary authority similar to that held by the other carriers will be granted at this time. Their requests to maintain "parcel" rates will be scheduled for hearing along with other such petitions.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

These carriers are R. J. Alexander and Ernest Sahli, copartners doing business as California Special Messenger Service and as Kelly Transfer Company; Merchants Parcel Delivery, a corporation; Frank J. Brown and Carl R. Moore, copartners doing business as A. & B. Garment Delivery of San Francisco; and Bernard LaRossa and John Anello, copartners doing business as Record Express. Their temporary authority was granted by Decisions Nos. 40442, 40477, 40506 and 40555 of June 24, June 28, July 8 and July 22, 1947, respectively. Their requests to maintain "parcel" rates have been partially heard. The matters have been temporarily removed from the hearing calendar at the request of the parties and will be scheduled for further hearing in the near future.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Don D'Onofrio and John R. Barr be and they are hereby authorized to observe rates not lower than those set forth in Item 95 of Exhibit "A" of Decision No. 28632 of March 16, 1936, as amended, in this proceeding for "wholesale parcel city delivery" service between points within the City and County of San Francisco until the further order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
