OPINION AND ORDER


This application concerns the proposed transfer of public utility warehouse property situated at Stratford and known as "Heck Bros. Warehouse." G. B. Chinn acquired this property from the estate of O. C. Heck, deceased, by virtue of an order of the Superior Court of Kings County. By this application, Chinn seeks authority to sell the property and Cecil H. Fowler and Hazel Del F. Fowler seek authority to purchase it. A cash consideration of \$19,500 is involved. The Fowlers propose no change in rates or in the service available to the public.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing;

IT IS HEREBY CROERED that G. B. Chinn be and he is hereby authorized to sell the public utility warehouse property involved in this proceeding to Cecil H. Fowler and Hazel Del F. Fowler in accordance with the terms of the agreement on file herein; and that, within sixty (60) days from the effective date hereof and on not less than five (5) days! notice to the Commission and to the public,Cecil H. Fowler and Hazel Del F. Fowler shall file rates, rules and regulations identical with thosenow on file covering operations of

the "Heck Bros. Warehouse" at Stratford; that in all other respects the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61; and that, concurrently with the establishment of the above described rates, rules and regulations by Cecil H. Fowler and Hazel Del F. Fowler, the rates on file in the name of "Heck Bros. Warehouse" be and they are hereby canceled.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
