SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

James L. Chase, doing business as Jim's Delivery Service, operates a parcel delivery service between Bakersfield and points in the vicinity of that city. He seeks exemption from the established minimum rates in so far as shipments of 100 pounds or less are concerned. Other parcel carriers handling shipments of such weight have heretofore been authorized to deviate from the minimum rates. Chase should be granted like authority in connection with the similar service he provides. A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decisions Nos. 31606 and 33977, as amended, in Cases Nos. 4246 and 4293, be and they are hereby further amended by adding James L. Chase to the lists of carriers set forth in paragraph (c) of Finding No. 14 of Decision No. 31606 and in paragraph (b) of Finding No. 12 of Decision No. 33977.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
