FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION

By Decision No. 41069, dated December 22, 1947, the Commission, among other things, authorized Southern California Gas Company to purchase and acquire from Coast Counties Gas and Electric Company its butane-air gas systems in Imperial County which serve three operating areas, namely, El Centro, Brawley and Calexico. Paragraph "4" of the order in the decision reads as follows:

"Southern California Gas Company, within six (6) months after acquiring said gas systems, shall file with the Commission for approval, its request to distribute the purchase price to primary fixed capital and other accounts and its proposed journal entries to carry such distribution into effect."

Such filings were made within the prescribed time.

The agreed purchase price for the gas systems was based on the book figures of Coast Counties Gas and Electric Company as of September 30, 1947, for fixed capital, construction work in progress, materials and supplies, less the book depreciation reserve, plus an addition of 10%. A proposed journal entry dated as of June 30, 1948, filed by Southern California Gas Company, shows that the company, in acquiring the systems, paid the sum of \$838,429.98 which was arrived at in the following manner:

Southern California Gas Company proposes to distribute said \$909,237.06 to its primary fixed capital (plant) accounts as follows:

It appears that the individual amounts represent costs recorded on the books of Coast Counties Gas and Electric Company, with certain adjustments and transfers between accounts, with, however, the addition of the sum of \$77,857.79 to Account 303, Miscellaneous Intangible Capital, which amount represents the 10%

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premium agreed upon in the purchase contract and certain other adjustments.

The Commission, by Decision No. 42068, dated September 21, 1948, adopted and prescribed for gas utilities a new system of accounts effective January 1, 1949. Said new system of accounts, among other things, requires each gas utility to classify its investment in its properties on the basis of original cost, as that term is defined in the system of accounts.

The distribution of the sum of \$909,237.06 to accounts under the system now in effect, as now proposed, accordingly will be of a temporary nature. To close the present proceeding, the Commission will approve the entry as submitted. However, upon receipt and review of Southern California Gas Company's classification of its plant accounts in accordance with the new system of accounts, we will consider the amounts comprising said sum in the light of the definitions and instructions contained in said new system and determine the propriety of including said amounts, or any part thereof, in gas plant accounts.

SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Commission having considered the request of Southern California Gas Company for approval of a certain journal entry, as indicated in the foregoing opinion, and being of the opinion that the request should be granted as provided herein,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern California Gas Company may record on its books its proposed journal entry dated June 30, 1948, to distribute the cost of acquiring gas systems

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from Coast Counties Gas and Electric Company under the authority granted by Decision No. 41069, dated December 22, 1947, provided that the Commission reserves the right to consider de novo said entry when Southern California Gas Company files its classification of its plant accounts in accordance with the uniform system of accounts for gas utilities adopted and prescribed by Decision No. 42068.
