SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Applicants transport flour in truckload lots within San Diego for certain bakeries. Prior orders in this proceeding have authorized them to assess, for this service, rates and accessorial charges less than those established as minima. Their authority is scheduled to expire October 29, 1948. A one-year extension is now sought.

The verified supplemental application shows that the general conditions under which the service in question is performed are substantially the same as those prevailing when this matter was last considered; that operations have been profitable under the authorized rates; that increased labor and fuel costs have been offset by improvements in unloading procedures; and that the present rates may reasonably be expected to yield a satisfactory profit during the period of the sought extension.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary, and that the granting of the supplemental application is justified. To preserve a continuity of

rates, the order will be made effective concurrently with the expiration of the present authority.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted Floyd A. Greene and D. J. Glardon, copartners, by Decision No. 39572 of October 29, 1947, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby extended to October 29, 1949, unless sooner changed or further extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective October 29, 1948.
