

Pacific Greyhound Lines, which operates over a portion of the proposed route, was served with a copy of the application, but has offered no protest.

From the record it appears that public convenience and necessity require the proposed extension of service. However, it is the opinion of the Commission that it is not in the public interest to authorize said extension on a temporary basis or trial period as requested. The service will be authorized on a permanent basis. Subsequently if patronage of the line does not justify its continued operation applicant may petition the Commission for appropriate relief.

O R D E R

An application therefor having been filed and it having been found that public convenience and necessity require the service proposed by applicant,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to San Jose City Lines, Inc., authorizing the establishment and operation of service as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 24 of the Public Utilities Act, for the transportation of passengers over and along the following route:

Commencing at the intersection of Alma Avenue and Monterey Road thence along Monterey Road to the intersection of Monterey Road and Stone Avenue. From the intersection of Monterey Road and Pheland Avenue thence along Pheland Avenue, Senter Road, Keyes Street, thence on Keyes Street to the intersection of Keyes Street and South Tenth Street.

This certificate is granted as an extension and enlargement of and consolidated with the certificate granted by Decision 34194.

(2) In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:

- (a) Applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted within a period of not to exceed 30 days from the effective date hereof.
- (b) Within 60 days from the effective date hereof and on not less than 5 days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and comply with the provisions of General Order No. 79 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A, by filing in triplicate and concurrently making effective, appropriate tariffs and time tables.

The effective date of this order shall be 20 days after the date hereof.
