THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

This proceeding involves rates for the transportation of petroleum fuel oil from Monterey to San Juan. The oil is shipped by Tide Water Associated Oil Company to Pacific Portland Cement Company. Decision No. 41849 of July 20, 1948 authorized applicant to perform this service for the oil company at a rate less than the minimum rate but not less than 6 cents per 100 pounds. By petition filed February 18, 1949, applicant alleges that transportation charges are now paid by the cement company, but that there has been no change in the character of the service performed. It requests that transportation for the cement company be specifically included in the authority.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary, and that the granting of the petition is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

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IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 41849 of July 20, 1948, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby amended by adding in the ordering paragraph thereof after the words "Tide Water Associated Oil Company" the words "or for Pacific Portland Cement Company."

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
