BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of ROBERT LANDIER for permission to abandon passenger motor coach service between San Pedro, City of Los Angeles, and the Harbor Hills District in the County of Los Angeles, State of California.

<u>O P I N I O N</u>

Robert Landier requests authority to discontinue and abandon his operation of service as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 22 of the Public Utilities Act, for the transportation of passengers between San Pedro, City of Los Angeles, and the Harbor Hills District in the County of Los Angeles, California. Applicant was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity on October 9, 1945, by this Cormission to (1) operate said passenger motor coach service (1)

A public hearing was held before Examiner Rowe at San Pedro on March 8, 1949, at which time oral and documentory evidence was adduced and the matter was submitted for decision.

According to the testimony of Mr. Landier and his accountant and auditor, Mr. Ted F. Rafalovich, this bus line has never been

profitable. During the calendar year 1946, the line sustained a net loss of \$884.07, during 1947, a net loss of \$12,843.50, and during 1948, a net loss of \$3,341.20.

Mr. Rafalovich also testified that the operating loss on the Harbor Hills Route continued in spite of an increase in rates granted applicant effective September 1, 1943. Mr. Landier testified that at present the Pacific Grevhound Lines serves the territory as to which abandonment is sought, and, consequently, the public interest and necessity would not be adversely affected thereby.

Notice of hearing and of the proposed abandonment was, according to the evidence, duly posted in the Harbor Hills buses from February 21, 1949, through March 7, 1949. No one protested the granting of the application herein.

Upon full consideration of the record in this proceeding it is found as a fact that applicant's Harbor Hills motor bus operation has not been, and cannot be made, profitable and that the public interest will not be adversely affected by the proposed abandonment of applicant's service over the Harbor Hills Route. Accordingly the application will be granted.

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Application as above entitled having been filed, a public hearing having been held, and the matter being under submission;

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That Robert Landier be, and he is hereby, authorized to abandon and discontinue his passenger stage service between San

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Pedro, City of Los Angeles, and the Harbor Hills District in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, described as follows:

"Beginning at the intersection of Fifth Street and Harbor Boulevard in San Pedro, thence along Fifth Street, Pacific Avenue, Sixth Street, Harbor Boulevard, Wilmington, San Pedro.Road, Channel Street, Gaffey Street, Anaheim Street, Western Avenue, Palos Verdes Drive to its intersection with Gaffey Street, Gaffey Street, Channel Street, Wilmington and San Pedro Road; Harbor Boulevard to Fifth Street."

(2) That the applicant be, and he is hereby, authorized to cancel all fares, rules, regulations and schedules applying to its said Harbor Hills Bus Line.

(3) That the operating rights conferred under authority of the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Robert Landier in the order of Decision No. 38291, as amended, over said described route known as the Harbor Hills Bus Line, is hereby revoked and annulled.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
