O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct a spur track at grade across County Road No. 438 (Lay Avenue) near Red Bluff, Tehama County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 2-222.6-C. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the road now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding two per cent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (G. O. No. 75-B). Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

It is alleged that further delays to the operations of the industry to be served by said track will create a fire hazard in its storage of lumber and applicant requests that this order be made effective immediately.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization

may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
