ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY INTERIM RELIEF

M. S. Martin having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that complainant's telephone service at 8441 San Antonio, South Gate, California, under number Lafayette 1476, has been disconnected by defendant; that said communication facilities were not used as an instrumentality to violate the law nor in aiding or abetting such violation, but were in fact used for personal and social calls; and that irreparable injury and great hardship will result unless said service is restored pending hearing and decision on the complaint; therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company is hereby directed to restore telephone service to complainant pending a hearing on said complaint and further Commission order thereon. The complaint, assigned to Commissioner Huls, is set for hearing before such Examiner as may hereafter be designated, at 1:30 o'clock p.m. on Tuesday, August 23, 1949, in the Commission Court Room, Ninth Floor, The Mirror Building, 145 South Spring Street, Los Angeles, California.

The Secretary is directed to cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be served upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its reply to said complaint within ten (10) days after such service. The Secretary is directed further to cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainant.
