SHORE to hire and take said property and engage in the warehouseman's business during the term of the lease.

OPINION AND ORDER

San Benito County Feed & Warehouse Company operates a public utility warehouse at Tres Pinos, San Benito County. It seeks authority to lease the warehouse property and equipment to Ceorge B. Shore for a five-year period.

The verified application shows that the company desires to center its activities at Hollister; and that Shore, an experienced warehouseman, will devote his full time to the conduct of the Tres Pinos operations. No change is proposed in the service available to the public or in the rates therefor.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary, and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that San Benito County Feed & Warehouse Company may, within sixty (60) days after the effective date of this order, lease the warehouse property and equipment involved in this proceeding to George B. Shore for a five-year period, as requested; that, prior to the effective date of said

lease, San Benito County Feed & Warehouse Company and George B. Shore shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, supplement or reissue tariffs on file with the Commission, in so far as they name rates, rules and regulations governing warehouse operations of San Benito County Feed & Warehouse Company at Tres Pinos, to show that the company has withdrawn and cancelled and Shore has concurrently adopted or established as his own said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
