ORDER

The Department of Public Works of the State of California is authorized to construct Route 187 at grade across the Sandia Branch of Southern Pacific Company, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BNB-699.1. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two (2) feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than thirty-two (32) feet, and grades of approach not greater than one (1) per cent... Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72. Protection shall be by one Standard No. 3 wigwag, to be relocated from existing Crossing No. BNB-699.2, and one Standard No. 1-A crossing sign (G. O. 75-B). Upon completion, Crossing No. BNB-699.2, about three hundred twenty-five (325) feet south, shall be abandoned and closed.

Within thirty (30) days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. This authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
