## OPINION

Pacific Motor Trucking Company, applicant in the aboveentitled application, as amended, is now providing a highway common
carrier service between certain rail stations on the lines of the
Southern Pacific Company, Sunset Railway Company and Visalia
Electric Railroad Company, in the San Joaquin Valley between Tracy
(1)
and Bakersfield. Said service is limited by Decisions Nos. 27235
and 27744 to such freight as previously may have been consigned for
transportation over the line of any of the above-named rail carriers
and which may be delivered to the applicant at certain rail stations
by any of said rail carriers and redelivered by the applicant at
another of said rail stations. Applicant seeks authority, as an
extension and enlargement of its existing rights, to render a pickup
and delivery service within a one mile radius of various intermediate
rail points, which are located on routes over which applicant is
presently operating. Said rail points are as follows: Goble, Saco,

Prospero, Slater, Harpertown, Archa, Coronet, Claribel, Maltermoro, Sunnyside, Cameo, Tarpey and Melvin, on the line of the Southern Pacific Company; Bannister, on the line of the Sunset Railway Company; and Strader and Wible Orchard, on the lines of the Sunset Railway Company and Southern Pacific Company.

It is alleged, as justification for the authority sought, that due to the growth which has taken place in the San Joaquin Valley in the past several years various industries, packing sheds and stores located at or near those rail stations have requested an expedited store-door service; that there are no local draymen to render the requested service; and applicant cannot presently render the service even though equipment of applicant passes through these locations for the purpose of serving adjacent points pursuant to authority previously granted.

Other carriers serving the territory involved have informed the Commission that they have no objection to the granting of this application provided applicant is not permitted to operate a through service between Fresno and Pakersfield by linking up its operative rights. Applicant was restricted in Decision No. 37850 from operating a through service. The key point restriction at Lordo then imposed will apply here.

By the amendment to its application, Pacific Motor Trucking Company excluded uncrated household goods and related articles from the commodities it proposes to transport.

After full consideration of the evidence of record, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that public convenience and necessity require that this application be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

- (2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
  - a. Applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted within a period of not to exceed 30 days from the effective date hereof.
  - b. Within 60 days from the effective date hereof and on not less than 5 days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall comply with the provisions of General Order No. 80 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A, by filing, in triplicate, and concurrently making effective, appropriate tariffs and time schedules.

The effective date of this order shall be 20 days after the date hereof.
