ORDER

In this application Pacific Greyhound Lines requests a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate passenger stage service between Sonora and Columbia, Tuolumne County, during the period of the Columbia Centennial celebration, from Friday, July 15, 1949 through Sunday, July 17, 1949.

Applicant alleges that automobiles will not be allowed to enter the Columbia area but will have to park in Sonora and vicinity which is about four miles from the site of the celebration. Therefore, the only available transportation for the service required will be that proposed by applicant. Applicant proposes a fare of 15 cents one way.

George M. Trask, doing business as Columbia Stage Line, is the only other carrier in the area, and he has no objection to the granting of this application.

It appears that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the request should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be granted to Pacific Greyhound Lines, authorizing the establishment and operation of service as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 2-1/4 of the Public Utilities Act, for the transportation of passengers between Sonora and Columbia, Tuolumne County, from Friday, July 15, 1949, to and including Sunday, July 17, 1949,

over the most feasible route or routes subject to the following conditions:

- (1) Applicant may turn its motor vehicles at termini or intermediate points, as service to the public may require.
- (2) The authority herein granted shall lapse and be of no further effect on July 18, 1949.
