SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

In Applications Nos. 27647, 28539 and 29963, Lang Transportation Corporation, Clark E. Seargeant, Audrey L. Seargeant and Roger E. Seargeant, doing business as Seargeant Transportation Company, and Pacific Truck Service, Inc. have been authorized, under Section 11 of the Highway Carriers' Act, to transport bulk petroleum products from Monterey to San Juan, from San Marino to Ventura, and from Shell Point to Martinez, respectively, at rates less than the minimum rates otherwise applicable.

Recently these carriers obtained certificates of public convenience and necessity to operate as highway common carriers. Decision No. 43021 of June 21, 1949, in these proceedings, authorized them to establish in their common carrier tariffs on or prior to August 17, 1949, rates of the same volume as those assessed under the Section 11 orders. That decision also extended to August 17, 1949, the expiration dates of the Section 11 authorities held by Lang and Seargeant. By petition, extension of the aforesaid authorities to September 19, 1949, is now sought.

The verified petition shows that the tariff publications cannot be accomplished by August 17, 1949, and that extension of the respective authorities are necessary to preserve the existing bases of rates. The sought extensions are justified and will be granted. A public hearing is not necessary. To prevent a lapse of the authorities, the order herein will be made effective August 17, 1949.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the date of "August 17, 1949" appearing in the fourth and twentieth lines of the ordering paragraph of Decision No. 43021 of June 21, 1949, in these proceedings, be and it is hereby amended to read "September 19, 1949."

This order shall become effective August 17, 1949.
