OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, South End Warehouse Company, a corporation, seeks authority to transfer to Malcolm W. Lamb public utility warehouse property situated at San Francisco and also its right to conduct public utility warehouse operations in that city.

The verified application shows that, by reason of a resolution adopted by its Board of Directors, the corporation will be dissolved on December 31, 1949, and that its assets will be transferred to Lamb, the holder of all its issued and outstanding common stock. Lamb will operate the public utility warehouse business in question. No change in rates or in the service available to the public is proposed.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted. This action is not a determination of the existence, character or extent of operative rights. It merely permits Lamb to acquire whatever operative right is held by the corporation.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that South End Warehouse Company, a corporation, may, within ninety (90) days after the effective date of this order, sell and transfer the public utility warehouse operative right and property, equipment and fixtures involved in this

proceeding to Malcolm W. Lamb; that prior to the effective date of said sale and transfer, applicants shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public, supplement or reissue the tariffs on file with the Commission to show that South End Warehouse Company, a corporation, has withdrawn or canceled and that Malcolm W. Lamb has concurrently adopted or established as his own said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
