ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Pursuant to Decision No. 43482 of November 1, 1949, in this proceeding, South End Warehouse Company, a corporation, has transferred public utility warehouse operative rights and property situated at San Francisco to Malcolm W. Lamb, an individual. Lamb is now conducting the warehouse operations. The decision requires that the authorized transfer be accomplished not later than February 19, 1950. It does not involve city carrier permits or property. Nevertheless, by supplemental application filed January 19, 1950, South End Warehouse Company asks that an order be issued "extending the time" within which it may transfer its city carrier operative rights and property to Lamb. The Commission has today issued a city carrier permit to Lamb and revoked South End Warehouse Company's permit. Authority from the Commission is not required to transfer other city carrier property. Accordingly, the supplemental application will be dismissed.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the supplemental application filed January 19, 1950, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby dismissed.
