BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of LANDIER TRANSIT CO., INC., a corporation, for authority to extend the race track service to Santa Anita Park, said extension commencing from Vermont Avenue and Manchester Avenue joining with present service at Long Beach Boulevard at Florence Avenue.

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OPINION

Applicant is now operating a passenger stage service in Watts and vicinity (City of Los Angeles) and also a race track bus service between said area and the Santa Anita and Hollywood Park race tracks (1).

By this application, authority is sought to establish an additional route to the Santa Anita race track, commencing at the intersection of Manchester and Vermont Avenues, thence along Manchester Avenue, Compton Avenue, Florence Avenue, and continuing from the intersection of Florence Avenue and Long Beach Boulevard where the proposed route will join with its present race track route to the Santa Anita race track. In addition to the pickup and discharge points along its present route, applicant proposes to accommodate patrons along Manchester Avenue at the intersections of Broadway, Central Avenue, and Compton Avenue, and also at the intersections of Florence Avenue and Compton Avenue and Florence Avenue and Graham Avenue.

Applicant proposes to charge a fare of \$1.302, plus tax, per round trip, along the new route westerly of the intersection of Long Beach Boulevard and Florence Avenue, and present fares will prevail at points along its present route.

The proposed service is not competitive with that of other carriers, and the application is not opposed by the City of Los Angeles.

As justification for the granting of the application, applicant alleges that no direct service to and from said race track - is now available at the points proposed to be served; that the proposed route passes through business districts and residential areas where a demand exists for the service.

The Commission, having fully considered the application, finds that public convenience and necessity require the establishment and operation of the service proposed herein. The application will be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

ORDER

Application having been filed, the Commission being fully advised in the premises and having found that public convenience and necessity so require,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity be, and it hereby is, granted to Landier Transit Co., Inc., a corporation, authorizing the establishment and operation of a service as a "passenger stage corporation", as defined in Section 24 of the

Beginning at the intersection of Vermont Avenue and Manchester Avenue, thence along Manchester Avenue, Compton Avenue, Florence Avenue to its intersection with Long Beach Boulevard.

Applicant is authorized to turn motor vehicles at termini and intermediate points, in either direction, at intersections of streets or by operating around a block contiguous to such intersection, or in accordance with local traffic rules.
