OPINION

Southern California Edison Company in this proceeding asks for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to exercise the rights and privileges of a franchise granted by the City of La Habra, permitting the installation, maintenance and use of an electric distribution and transmission system upon the streets of said city.

The franchise referred to, a copy of which is attached to the application and designated as Exhibit "A," was granted by the city in accordance with the Franchise Act of 1937, and is of indeterminate duration. A fee is payable annually to the city equivalent to two per cent of the gross receipts arising from the use, operation or possession of the franchise, but not less than one per cent of all the sales of electricity within the limits of such city under said franchise.

The costs incurred by applicant in obtaining the franchise are stated to have been \$31.45, excluding the filing fee of \$50 and \$5 for publication of notice of the hearing.
