ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY INTERIM RELIEF

Joseph S. Goodman and Leon I. Marchasin having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that their telephone service at 3741 South Vermont Avenue, in the County of Los Angeles, California, under number Pleasant 39512, has been disconnected by defendant; that said communication facilities were not used as an instrumentality to violate the law nor in aiding or abetting such violation, but were in fact used for emergency needs, and social and business calls; and that irreparable injury and great hardship will result unless said service is restored pending hearing and decision on the complaint; therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company is hereby directed to restore telephone service to complainants pending a hearing on said complaint and further Commission order thereon. The complaint, assigned to Commissioner Huls, shall be set for hearing at such time and place as may hereafter be designated, and the Secretary shall cause notices of hearing to be mailed to the parties at least ten days before the date of such hearing.

The Secretary is directed to cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be served

upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its reply to said complaint within ten days after such service. The Secretary is directed further to cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainants.
