Good Cause Appearing IT IS ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is authorized to abolish by physical closing the crossing of the publicly-used road known as Kamm Avenue with its main line track in the vicinity of milepost 224.0 near Kingsburg, Fresno County, as more particularly shown on the map attached to the application. In abolishing said crossing applicant shall remove the crossing and its approaches within the limits of its right of way and erect suitable barricades in such a manner as to effectively prevent the use of the crossing by vehicular traffic.

Within thirty days after closing pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless

time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.
